From the Superintendent

With the beginning of a new year come opportunities for new beginnings and for exciting possibilities. Over the summer, the administrators have worked hard in preparing for the new year including the development of new school improvement plans for each building. We are focusing on the review of data from this past year's assessments to help us better understand where we need to focus our efforts. We are ready for a "great" year.

The custodial/maintenance staff has been hard at work cleaning and preparing the buildings for the arrival of the students. This summer we were able to take on a number of *Building and Site Sinking Fund* projects including:

1. partial roof replacement at Hollywood Elementary
2. installation of parking lot lighting at Stewart, Roosevelt, the middle school, and the north side of the high school.
3. exterior renovation work at all buildings to repair leaks as

well as repair stucco fascia on the high school

4. carpet replacement in a variety of classrooms at each building
5. partial domestic water pipe replacement at Stewart
6. installation of dance floor at high school

We are blessed to have a *Building and Site Sinking Fund*. This fund, approved five years ago by the voters, allows us to keep our buildings in good shape, while not impacting dollars for the classroom.

During this school year, we will be working diligently to conserve resources such as electricity and paper usage. We will be putting more information on the district website at www.lakeshoreschools.k12.mi.us versus printing and sending home. We will also be emphasizing turning off lights when leaving a room. These savings can be significant for us as we find ways to be green friendly and cost conscious.

I continue to encourage all parents to be sure that your information is up to date on *Instant Alert*. This is our system of notifying you of emergencies, school closings, special announcements, etc. The details on *how to update your information* are included in this edition of the Light. I am also asking that you provide your e-mail address.

This updating is critical for effective communication.

The *Center for Disease Control* is currently in the process of updating their procedures for dealing with H1N1 Flu (Swine Flu). As soon as these are given to us we will share with you. Several ways in which you can help is to work with your children on proper hygiene including washing hands on a regular basis and covering their mouth when coughing. I ask you to keep your child home when they have a temperature, develop a cough, etc. This will certainly help to control other students getting sick. We do know that the CDC does not suggest closing schools if someone comes down with H1N1.

We are looking forward to a great year. I ask you to partner with us as we strive to provide the best education possible for the children of this community. We are committed to Focusing on Every Child Every Day as we strive to move from Good to Great.

2. If you are not a staff member of the school, click on "Parent" in the *New User* box.
3. If you are a staff member and a parent in the school, click on either "Parent" or "Staff" in the *New User* box.
4. Complete the student information form. Click "Submit."
5. Complete the corresponding screen. Click "Submit."
6. After receiving the confirmation message, click "Proceed" to get started with Instant Alert.
7. **Note:** Remember your *Login Name* and *Password* so you may use it to update your profile -- also, bookmark the site.

View and check details about yourself and your family members

1. Upon successful login, click on "My Family."
2. Click on a parent name to view and edit parent details.
3. Click on a student name to view details about your children enrolled in this school.

Configure alert settings for yourself

1. Click on "Alert Setup."
2. Click on the check boxes to select which alert type you would like to have sent to which device. Click on "Save" when complete.
3. If you would like to add another contact device, select the device type, and enter the device details. Select the person to whom the device belongs and click on "Add."
4. For e-mail, text messaging, and pagers you may send yourself a test message. Click on "Send Test Message" to send yourself a message.

Lunch/Breakfast Information

Lunch/Breakfast prices have not been determined for the 2009/2010 school year. The prices will be set at the August school board meeting. If your child has lunch money left in their account from this past school year it will automatically be transferred to this school year. This also applies to students who are moving to a different school within the district. Elementary balances will transfer to the middle school. Last year's eighth grade student balances will now transfer to the high school. Please use envelopes that are provided when sending money with name and amount on front of envelope. Breakfast is available at Stewart, Hollywood, Roosevelt, and the middle school. Free/Reduced lunch applications will be sent home the first day of school. If your child was eligible for free/reduced last year, they will remain the same status for 30 days or until a new application is received. Lakeshore Middle School Drop-Off and Pick-Up Procedures

The following is a guide to assist you in the safe and orderly “drop-off” and “pick-up” procedures for Lakeshore Middle School students.

A.M. Drop-Off Procedure

* All car traffic enters the East end of the middle school parking lot from John Beers Road. There are two lanes for entering the parking lot at this point.

* The left lane of traffic gradually merges into the right lane. This merge is complete at the first set of traffic cones. The right lane has now become the “Drop-Off” lane.

* Students may begin exiting the right side of their vehicle and should remain on the right side of the painted yellow line. This allows students to enter the building safely without crossing traffic.

* Please continue pulling forward as far and as soon as possible. Vehicles at the rear of the line begin to back up when too much space spans between cars.

* After your student has exited the vehicle, pull into the left lane of traffic as this is the passing lane to exit the parking lot. Please be alert for any pedestrians in the crosswalks.

* All car traffic exits back onto John Beers Road via the West end of the parking lot. Right and left turn lanes are marked.

A.M. Park and Drop-Off Procedure

* If you wish to park the vehicle and drop off your student, enter the East end of the parking lot using the left lane as described above. Don’t merge into the right lane but continue left into the parking area and stop in any available parking spot.

* For their safety, students must cross at one of the two pedestrian crosswalks.

* Exit the parking area and lot using the passing lane as described above.

P.M. Pick-Up Procedure

* All car traffic enters the East end of the middle school parking lot from John Beers Road. There are two lanes for entering the parking lot at this point.

* The left lane of traffic gradually merges into the right lane. This merge is complete at the first set of traffic cones. The right lane has now become the “Pick-Up” lane.

* Students will remain on the sidewalk next to the school building until their ride has been spotted in the parking area and/or waits in the “Pick-Up” lane. Students may walk to their vehicle using the designated crosswalk areas.

* Please continue pulling forward as far and as soon as possible. *Vehicles at the rear of line begin to back up when too much space spans between cars.*

* After your student has entered the vehicle, pull into the left lane of traffic as this is the passing lane to exit the parking lot. Please be alert for any pedestrians in the crosswalks.

* All car traffic exits back onto John Beers Road via the West end of the parking lot. Right and left turn lanes are marked. Personal vehicles are not allowed in the parking lot at the front of the middle school building during these times as space is reserved for bus traffic only.

With your cooperation, patience, and attention to these procedures, the process for getting your student to school in a safe and timely manner will go smoothly.

RIGHTS UNDER THE PROTECTION OF PUPIL RIGHTS AMENDMENT (PPRA)

PPRA affords parents certain rights regarding our conduct of surveys, collection and use of information for marketing purposes, and certain physical exams. These include the right to:

Consent before students are required to submit to a survey that concerns one or more of the following protected areas (“protected information survey”) if the survey is not funded in whole or in part by a program of the U.S. Department of Education (ED) –

1. Political affiliations or beliefs of the student or student’s parent;
2. Mental or psychological problems of the student or student’s family;
3. Sex behavior or attitudes;
4. Illegal, anti-social, self-incriminating, or demeaning behavior;
5. Critical appraisals of others with whom respondents have close family relationships;
6. Legally recognized privileged relationships, such as with lawyers, doctors, or ministers;
7. Religious practices, affiliations, or beliefs of the student or parents; or
8. Income, other than as required by law to determine program eligibility.

Receive notice and an opportunity to opt a student out of –

1. Any other protected information survey, regardless of funding;
2. Any non-emergency, invasive physical exam or screening required as a condition of attendance, administered by the school or its agent, and not necessary to protect the immediate health and safety of a student, except for hearing, vision, or scoliosis screenings, or any physical exam or screening permitted or required under State law; and
3. Activities involving collection, disclosure, or use of personal information obtained from students for marketing or to sell or otherwise distribute the information to others.

Inspect, upon request and before administration or use –

1. Protected information surveys of students;
2. Instruments used to collect personal information from student for any of the above marketing, sales, or other distribution purposes; and
3. Instructional material used as part of the educational curriculum.

These rights transfer to from the parents to a student who is 18 years old or an emancipated minor under State law.

Lakeshore Public Schools will directly notify parents of these policies at least annually at the start of each school year and after any substantive changes. Lakeshore Schools will also directly notify, such as through U.S. Mail or email, parents of students who are scheduled to participate in the specific activities or surveys noted below and will provide an opportunity for the parent to opt his or her child out of participation of the specific activity or survey. Lakeshore Schools will make this notification to parents at the beginning of the school year if the District has identified the specific or approximate dates of the activities or surveys at that time. For surveys and activities scheduled after the school year starts, parents will be provided reasonable notification of the planned activities and surveys listed below and be provided an opportunity to opt their child out of such activities and surveys. Parents will also be provided an opportunity to review any pertinent surveys. Following is a list of the specific activities and surveys covered under this requirement:

- Collection, disclosure, or use of personal information for marketing, sales or other distribution.
- Administration of any protected information survey not funded in whole or in part by ED.
- Any non-emergency, invasive physical examination or screening as described above.

Notice of Right to Access
and Privacy of Records

Parents and guardians of each student under 19 years of age and each student who is 19 years of age or older have certain rights respecting the records kept on the student by the Lakeshore Public Schools.

These rights include:

- 1.) The right to examine the student's record upon completion of the proper forms as provided by the school administrator.
- 2.) The right to have the administration hear evidence that any part of the record is inaccurate, misleading or violates a student's privacy or other rights, to have the record changed if the administration agrees with the applicant's evidence and to insert an explanation in the record if the administration disagrees.
- 3.) The right to have records which personally refer to a student kept confidential except either by consent of the parent, student, or when being used by school personnel for school business. Certain official agencies may also request records. Within 14 days after enrolling a transfer student, the school shall request in writing directly from the student's previous school a copy of his or her school record. Any school that compiles records for each student in the school and that is requested to forward a copy of a transferring student's record to the new school shall comply within 30 days after receipt of the request unless the record has been tagged pursuant to section 1134 (section 1134 deals with records of missing students).

The following information is subject to release (upon request for information) in the form of student directories, programs, and news releases: student's name, address, photo, telephone number, date of birth, participation in officially recognized activities and sports, weight and height of members of athletic teams, dates of attendance, degrees and awards received, and the most recent previous school attended.

If a parent or student does not wish this information to be available for publication, notice must be given to the building principal by September 1 of each school year.

- 4.) The right to obtain a copy of the Board of Education Policy on privacy of Student Records from the office of the Superintendent of Schools.

- 5.) The right to protest if the school district is not complying with the Family Rights and Privacy Act.

Advisory To All Parents

Lakeshore Public Schools has adopted an Integrated Pest Management program. Inherent with this are the District's efforts to reduce pesticide use as much as possible. While it may occasionally be necessary to apply a pesticide, these will only be used as a last resort. This program does not rely on routine pesticide applications to resolve problems. We use various techniques such as habitat alteration, sanitation, mechanical means, exclusion, etc. to prevent pest from becoming a problem.

You will receive advanced notice of the application of a pesticide, other than bait or gel formulations at your child's school. This advance notice of the application will be given 48 hours before the application. The law requires us to do this notification by using two methods. The first method required by the law is the posting at entrances to your child's school. The entrances that will be posted are the primary entrances to the building from the parking lot(s). The second method we are going to use is the posting in a common area located by the main office of the school. Parents are also entitled to receive this notice by first class United States mail postmarked at least three days before the application.

If you would like to be notified by mail please contact the Business Office at the 269-428-1400, ext. 2952. Please give the Business Office secretary your name, mailing address, and what school your child attends.

In an emergency (for example, bees nest), pesticides may be applied without prior notice, but if you desire you will be provided notice following any such application.

You may review our IPM program or pesticide application records for your child's school by calling or e-mailing Robert Burgess, the District's Chief Financial Officer at phone number 269-428-1400, ext. 2951.
