THE LAKESHORE COMMUNITY

The Lakeshore Public School district, located along Lake Michigan in Southwestern Michigan adjacent to St. Joseph and Benton Harbor, is composed of the Stevensville and Baroda communities. Lakeshore is a suburban community with a mixture of light industry, agriculture, and subdivisions. The combination of suburban living within easy driving distance of Chicago, South Bend, and Kalamazoo attracts managerial and professional families. The school system is composed of three K-5 elementary buildings, one 6-8 middle school, and one high school.
