Welcome to the 2016-2017 School Year

One of the joys of being in public school education is that every new school year brings with it a renewed spirit of excitement.

Together with the community, Lakeshore has created programs and provides the facilities that create many pathways to success for our students.

This is especially true in Lakeshore Public Schools this year for many reasons. First, the building renovations and technology upgrades that were the cornerstone of the 2013

Bond have been completed. The focus of this work has been to create facilities that support innovation and provide

state-of-the-art technologies to our staff and students at every moment of the day. The improvements included enhanced science labs and CTE spaces, interactive classroom technology, and a robust infrastructure that supports 1:1 technology. We are also finalizing the transformation of our media centers through a \$600,000 commitment from the Lakeshore Excellence Foundation. Lakeshore students will be greeted this fall in upgraded, technology rich schools led by exceptional teachers and leaders.

None of this would have been possible without the support of our outstanding community.

In addition to the facilities and technology upgrades, we have completed an

extensive study of our District, a study that provides the basis for our work moving forward. That work will honor our traditions and push us forward while we create programs that support the individual growth of our students as they prepare for an ever-changing world. This year, we will begin to roll out a Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM) curriculum at Lakeshore Middle School, with offerings expanding to Lakeshore High School and our three elementary schools in the coming years. Again, this effort is being supported by the Lakeshore Excellence Foundation. Additionally, Lakeshore will also offer Machine Tooling for the first time in a brand new facility created through the 2013 Bond. Also, Lakeshore High School will offer a Middle College program in partner-

Adam was a 2001 Lakeshore High School graduate. He was a strong athlete, starting for some great Lancer football squads. He threw shot put and discus (and occasionally ran 400's) and was team captain for a track team that won state. He excelled in the classroom and served two years on student council. Adam was a great individual on and off the field—a selfless teammate who ALWAYS put the team's objectives above and beyond personal accolades.

In April 2005, he graduated from Michigan Technological University with a Bachelor of Science in Civil Engineering degree. Adam was a recipient of the prestigious Thompson Scholarship, which is awarded to outstanding students in

the university's civil engineering program. After graduating from Michigan Tech, he accepted a civil engineering position with Pearson Construction Co.

Sadly, in July of 2006, Adam's life was cut way short by melanoma cancer. In memory of Adam, Hans Koppenhoefer has organized this yearly golf outing for the past seven summers. Overwhelming support of this event is received from former teammates, friends, teachers, coaches, community leaders and family. This once small outing among friends has grown into much more. A 501(c)(3) non-profit organization, AT53 Inc., founded in Adam's memory to award a yearly scholarship to an outstanding graduating Lakeshore High School senior.

AT 53 Inc. has proudly awarded \$5000.00 in scholarships in the past three years.

This year's recipient, Leah Wojahn will be attending Western Michigan University in the fall to study occupational therapy. This scholarship is awarded annually to an outstanding student who represents the hardworking and compassionate traits of Adam Tilly. Best of Luck Leah!

A Focus on Preparing our Students for the Future

Handwriting: As a district, we recently adopted Handwriting Without Tears as our handwriting program. Handwriting is a foundation skill that needs to be developed early as it affects students’ reading, writing, language use, and critical thinking. Handwriting is taught beginning in Young Fives and kindergarten with printing. Most students will achieve printing fluency by the end of second grade, then fluency and speed with cursive handwriting by the end of third grade. Teachers will receive training on their first Professional Development day to learn how to use and teach with the materials that all of our Y5-3rd grade students will receive. It will be exciting to have all of our classrooms on the same page with handwriting!

Online Learning: Elementary students at Lakeshore will now be receiving the opportunity to learn through several different online venues.

Keyboarding: Keyboarding Instruction for Kids program for students in grades two through five. Now our students can learn keyboarding skills during computer lab time! Feel free to review this site through typinginstructorforkids.com.

Reading Eggs: Across the three elementary buildings, each Young 5, kindergarten, and first grade student will have the opportunity to participate in individualized online reading activities. Through the Reading Eggs program, students will improve reading comprehension, decoding skills, and fluency at their own levels. Learn more about this program at: readingeggs.com.

Math Seeds: Along with Reading Eggs, students at all three elementaries will have the opportunity to participate in online and individualized math activities via Math Seeds. Drugs 101: What Parents Want to Know

“Parents come face-to-face with more than 70 drug paraphernalia items during an interactive drug education and prevention workshop presented by Saint Joseph Mercy Health System.”

Would you be able to tell if your teen was using drugs? Join the **“Voice. Change. Hope. Alliance.”** at a FREE educational seminar for adults to learn about the signs, symptoms, and current trends of teen drug use. Educators from Saint Joseph Mercy Health System will travel to Lakeshore High School on Saturday, October 15 to educate parents, grandparents, coaches, teachers and administrators about the various forms of drugs and the peer pressures facing students to use them. The adults-only presentation, *Drugs 101: What Parents Want to Know*, will be highlighted by an opportunity to explore a mock teenager’s bedroom set up for adults to observe and attempt to identify obvious and not-so-obvious drug related paraphernalia. The goal of this program is to empower participants with the knowledge that they need to spot warning signs of drug abuse in time to intervene and/or prevent it.

Notification of Rights Under FERPA

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) (20 U.S.C. § 1232g; 34 CFR Part 99) is a Federal law that protects the privacy of student education records. The law applies to all schools that receive funds under an applicable program of the U.S. Department of Education. FERPA gives parents certain rights with respect to their children's education records. These rights transfer to the student when he or she reaches the age of 18 or attends a school beyond the high school level. Students to whom the rights have transferred are "eligible students."

- Parents or eligible students have the right to inspect and review the student's education records maintained by the school. Schools are not required to provide copies of records unless, for reasons such as great distance, it is impossible for parents or eligible students to review the records. Schools may charge a fee for copies.
- Parents or eligible students have the right to request that a school correct records which they believe to be inaccurate or misleading. If the school decides not to amend the record, the parent or eligible student then has the right to a formal hearing. After the hearing, if the school still decides not to amend the record, the parent or eligible student has the right to place a statement with the record setting forth his or her view about the contested information.
- Generally, schools must have written permission from the parent or eligible student in order to release any information from a student's education record. However, FERPA allows schools to disclose those records, without consent, to the following parties or under the following conditions (34 CFR § 99.31):
 - School officials with legitimate educational interest;
 - Other schools to which a student is transferring;
 - Specified officials for audit or evaluation purposes;
 - Appropriate parties in connection with financial aid to a student;
 - Organizations conducting certain studies for or on behalf of the school;
 - Accrediting organizations;
 - To comply with a judicial order or lawfully issued subpoena;
 - Appropriate officials in cases of health and safety emergencies; and
 - State and local authorities, within a juvenile justice system, pursuant to specific State law.

Schools may disclose, without consent, "directory" information such as a student's name, address, telephone number, date and place of birth, honors and awards, and dates of attendance. However, schools must tell parents and eligible students about directory information and allow parents and eligible students a reasonable amount of time to request that the school not disclose directory information about them.

McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act

RIGHTS UNDER THE PROTECTION OF PUPIL RIGHTS AMENDMENT (PPRA)

PPRA affords parents certain rights regarding our conduct of surveys, collection and use of information for marketing purposes, and certain physical exams. These include the right to:

Consent before students are required to submit to a survey that concerns one or more of the following protected areas (“protected information survey”) if the survey is not funded in whole or in part by a program of the U.S. Department of Education (ED) –

1. Political affiliations or beliefs or of the student or student’s parent;
2. Mental or psychological problems of the student or student’s family;
3. Sex behavior or attitudes;
4. Illegal, anti-social, self-incriminating, or demeaning behavior;
5. Critical appraisals of others with whom respondents have close family relationships;
6. Legally recognized privileged relationships, such as with lawyers, doctors, or ministers;
7. Religious practices, affiliations, or beliefs of the student or parents; or
8. Income, other than as required by law to determine program eligibility.

Receive notice and an opportunity to opt a

student out of –

1. Any other protected information survey, regardless of funding;
2. Any non-emergency, invasive physical exam or screening required as a condition of attendance, administered by the school or its agent, and not necessary to protect the immediate health and safety of a student, except for hearing, vision, or scoliosis screenings, or any physical exam or screening permitted or required under State law; and
3. Activities involving collection, disclosure, or use of personal information obtained from students for marketing or to sell or otherwise distribute the information to others.

Inspect, upon request and before administration or use –

1. Protected information surveys of students;
2. Instruments used to collect personal information from student for any of the above marketing, sales, or other distribution purposes; and
3. Instructional material used as part of the educational curriculum.

These rights transfer to from the parents to a student who is 18 years old or an emancipated minor under State law.



PPRA Continued

Lakeshore Public Schools will directly notify parents of these policies at least annually at the start of each school year and after any substantive changes. Lakeshore Schools will also directly notify, such as through U.S. Mail or email, parents of students who are scheduled to participate in the specific activities or surveys noted below and will provide an opportunity for the parent to opt his or her child out of participation of the specific activity or survey. Lakeshore Schools will make this notification to parents at the beginning of the school year if the District has identified the specific or approximate dates of the activities or surveys at that time. For surveys and activities scheduled after the school year starts, parents will be provided reasonable notification of the planned activities and surveys listed below and be provided an opportunity to opt their child out of such activities and surveys. Parents will also be provide an opportunity to review any pertinent surveys. Following is a list of the specific activities and surveys covered under this requirement:

- Collection, disclosure, or use of personal information for marketing, sales or other distribution.
- Administration of any protected information survey not funded in whole or in part by ED.
- Any non-emergency, invasive physical examination or screening as described above.

Privacy Policy

Notice of Right to Access and Privacy of Records

Parents and guardians of each student under 19 years of age and each student who is 19 years of age or older have certain rights respecting the records kept on the student by the Lakeshore Public Schools.

These rights include:

- 1.) The right to examine the student’s record upon completion of the proper forms as provided by the school administrator.
- 2.) The right to have the administration

hear evidence that any part of the record is inaccurate, misleading or violates a student’s privacy or other rights, to have the record changed if the administration agrees with the applicant’s evidence and to insert an explanation in the record if the administration disagrees.

3.) The right to have records, which personally refer to a student kept confidential except either by consent of the parent, student, or when being used by school personnel for school business. Certain official agencies may also request records. Within 14 days after enrolling a transfer student, the school shall request in writing directly from the student’s previous school a copy of his or her school record. Any school that compiles records for each student in the school and that is requested to forward a copy of a transferring student’s record to the new school shall comply within 30 days after receipt of the request unless the record has been tagged pursuant to section 1134 (section 1134 deals with records of missing students).

The following information is subject to release (upon request for information) in the form of student directories, programs, and news releases: student’s name, address, photo, telephone number, date of birth, participation in officially recognized activities and sports, weight and height of members of athletic teams, dates of attendance, degrees and awards received, and the most recent previous school attended.

If a parent or student does not wish this information to be available for publication, notice must be given to the building principal by September 1 of each school year.

4.) The right to obtain a copy of the Board of Education Policy on privacy of Student Records from the office of the Superintendent of Schools.

5.) The right to protest if the school district is not complying with the Family Rights and Privacy Act.

Advisory To All Parents

Lakeshore Public Schools has adopted an Integrated Pest Management program. Inherent with this are the District’s efforts to reduce pesticide use as much as possible. While it may occasionally be necessary to apply a pesticide, these will only be used as a last resort. This program does not rely on routine pesticide applications to resolve problems. We use various techniques such as habitat alteration, sanitation, mechanical means, exclusion, etc. to prevent pests from becoming a problem.

You will receive advanced notice of the application of a pesticide, other than bait or gel formulations at your child’s school. This advance notice of the application will be given 48 hours before the application. The law requires us to do this notification by using two methods. The first method required by the law is the posting at entrances to your child’s school. The entrances that will be posted are the primary entrances to the building from the parking lot(s). The second method we are going to use is the posting in a common area located by the main office of the school. Parents are also entitled to receive this notice by first class United States mail postmarked at least three days before the application.

If you would like to be notified by mail please contact the Business Office at the (269) 428-1400. Please give the Business Office secretary your name, mailing address, and what school your child attends.

In an emergency (for example, bees’ nest), pesticides may be applied without prior notice, but if you desire you will be provided notice following any such application.
