Reconfirmation Meeting for MAY 2021

Reconfirm Instructional Delivery Method:

Option #1 - In-person Learning (may include hybrid schedule)

- Elementary Students will receive all typical instruction in the areas of ELA, Math, Science, Social Studies, and Specials (Guidance, PE, Art, Music).
- Middle School and High School students will receive access to all typical year course offerings.
- Teachers at all levels will teach their students about Google Classroom and how to navigate so students are ready should we experience a school closure and have to move to fully remote learning.

Option #2 - Virtual Learning

- Elementary remote learning students will be provided synchronous instruction (live) and asynchronous instruction (recorded or posted assignments) both provided by Lakeshore teachers. Teachers will be using Lakeshore curriculum resources, which will be aligned with what we are doing in the live classrooms. Google Classroom will be used to share/manage assignments and provide regular feedback.
- Middle School and High School students will be provided courses through Michigan Virtual courses and teachers. Lakeshore staff are serving as mentors to coordinate and monitor student work. Middle School and High School students will be able to participate in co-curricular activities.
- General Guidelines for all Virtual Students
 - Daily attendance is required.
 - Assignments and assessments will be required and graded.

- Students will receive progress reports and/or grades to reflect growth and achievement.
- Interventions and special education services will continue to be provided to eligible students.
- Students may transition back to in person learning at the semester if they choose.

Reconfirm how instruction will be delivered for each grade level:

The priority of the District is to provide a Full-Day/Five-Day model of instruction. Emphasis will be placed on continuing full time face-to-face instruction in elementary schools and for at-risk populations.

Pre-Kindergarten: In-Person Instruction
Elementary (Grades K - 5): In-Person Instruction with a Virtual Option (semester commitment)
Middle School (Grades 6 - 8): In-Person Instruction with a Virtual Option (semester commitment)
High School (Grades 9 - 12): In-Person Instruction with a Virtual Option (semester commitment)

Reconfirm whether or not the district is offering higher levels of in-person instruction for English language learners, special education students, or other special populations:

In-person instruction has been made available to all Lakeshore Public School students. We have encouraged families that have students with special needs to choose this option for their children. The District will continue to prioritize full-day/five-day in-person instruction for our students in special populations.

At the beginning of the school year, student IEPs, IFSPs, and 504 plans were reviewed in coordination with general and special education teachers and/or virtual education providers to address any data-driven accommodations and/or services needed due to known changes in students' needs.

For students from birth to five, those with identified special needs, and those attending CTE programming, intervention and support services will be integrated into the student's program immediately upon the start of school.

The district ensures a continuation of services for students receiving speech and language, occupational therapy, physical therapy, or social work services within their IFSP or IEP. The district also ensures a method for the continuation of evaluation for students suspected of having a disability as well as those requiring re-evaluation.

All special education staff are in weekly contact with families either by phone, email, or virtual meetings. Contingency plans are in place for all special ed students.
